

New Member Education: Local Ritual v. Leadership/Team-Building Activity

Purpose of Document: Clarify the distinction between a "local ritual" verses a "leadership/team-building activity" when submitted as part of a New Member Education plan. This document will serve to help delineate the meaning of the two types of programs and outline next steps for chapter members. Neither category should conflict with Beta values, history or lore.

(If not approved, can be appealed to the General Secretary or Board of Trustees.)	-The chapter should include details outlining the details of the activity and the role it plays in the new member process with their new member education materials.
